

**Key Vocabulary**

<b>Thank you</b>	An expression of gratitude when someone does something for you or gives you something.
<b>Thankfulness</b>	Feeling or showing gratitude. We are thankful when we are pleased and grateful for what we have.
<b>Gratitude</b>	Being thankful for things we have. Gratitude is pausing to appreciate things we normally take for granted like food and water.
<b>Gift</b>	A present or a special talent or ability. You can give things such as time/talent to help others.
<b>Prayer</b>	A way to communicate with God, often to say "thank you".
<b>Creator</b>	Many people believe that God created the world we live in.
<b>The World</b>	The Earth, the planet we live on and everything that lives on it. Psalm 24 v1 says "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it".
<b>Harvest</b>	To collect what has been planted and grown in the ground. It is usually done by farmers and in the autumn in the UK.
