Transport	Carrying people or goods from one place to another.	Sedan chairs were mainly used by wealthy people. The person would sit on a chair inside a cabin and would be carried by servants using poles.	
Steam engine	A steam engine uses steam from boiling water o make it move. The steam pushes the moving parts.	Horses and carts were used by people to travel and transport goods to other places.	
Petrol/combustion engine	Combustion means burning A petrol engine burns petrol to make it move.	The penny-farthing was a bicycle that had one large wheel at the front and one smaller wheel at the back.	
Electric cars	Electric cars use electricity to make the motor turn.	The steam train changed the way people moved goods and travelled. Many city people, even the poorer workers, were able to travel to the seaside for the first time.	
Thatched roof	Dried straw tied tightly together and laid on the roof of a building.	Karl Benz invented the first petrol engine car. Henry Ford created the Ford Motor Company. The Wright Brothers were the first people to successfully fly in a plane. George Stephenson built the first steam locomotive.
