PE and Sport Premium - End of Year Report 2019/20

Spend

- £7500 invested in coaching support from Carre's Grammar School Outreach, including 2 after-school sports clubs.
- £2340 invested in the Complete PE online resource, which supplies all staff with quality planning for a range of activities and sports.

Headlines

- The school achieved recognition of our continued provision for promoting sporting competition and leadership from the School Games.
- The school entered in to 10 inter-school competitions. Sports included: *Volleyball, Netball, Football, Rugby, Cross Country, Gymnastics, Hockey & Dance.*

Impact

- 54 children (72%) across KS2 represented the school in a Level 2 sporting competition.
- 9 different extra-curricular sports clubs were offered to children, including: *Football, Netball, Rugby, Dance, KS1 Multi-Skills & Gymnastics.*
- 160 extra-curricular sports club opportunities were given to children across the school.
- 82 children (51%) across the school attended an extra-curricular sports club during the year.

Continued Professional Development

- PE adviser and School Games Organiser (Matt Evans) met with PE Co-ordinator (Mr Frost) on a termly basis through face-to-face and online forums to discuss annual and short-term PE plans.
- Sports co-ordinator (Mr Frost) attended the Lincolnshire Sports Partnership PE conference at Bishop Grosseteste University, Lincoln.

Sustainability and Impact

- The school will continue to embed a culture of participation in extra-curricular activities, receiving support from school staff, who chose to run extra-curricular sports clubs.
- Staff have experienced and taught a plethora of sports and skills through the buy-in services of Carre's Grammar Outreach, which has ensured all staff-led PE lessons are now 'Good' to 'Outstanding'.
- Staff have been upskilled on skills based approaches to teaching PE, rather than focussing on a specific sport.

Targets for 2019/20

- To achieve 'Outstanding' PE for all staff through coach mentoring given by PE co-ordinator Mr Frost during PE lessons across the school.
- To sustain the achievement of the Gold School Games mark by continuing to ensure each child receives two hours of PE in their weekly curriculum and pushing the opportunities for children to learn to lead in sport.
