Phonics intervention	TA's continue to deliver daily interventions to service children who require additional support. This is often essential for those children who have joined us from Scotland or Wales.	£1000 – phonics screen £3400 additional TA salary to deliver interventions.	Prior to lockdown, the gap had closed in phonics and children new to us make accelerated progress. In 2019, with the exception of children with significant SEND, 100% of SPP children were on track to pass the phonics screen.
Close the gaps in maths for service children.	Additional maths no problem books for new Service children throughout the year.	£1550	Prior to lockdown, Service children were making outstanding progress with 100% reaching age related expectations. In reading and writing 25% were at greater depth and in maths, 50% were at greater depth.
Additional TA support	TAs support small groups to ensure learning gaps are closed. Additionally, all new children are 'baselined' to ensure we accurately assess progress.	£2200	
Nurture talent and ensure complete inclusion	Enrichment fund to nurture/support talented service children.	£1150	This year school has supported several Service children in attending school clubs. Additionally, where we have not received full time support for EHCPs, we have funding full-time 1:1. This has enabled these children to access the curriculum.
Collaborative learning	All staff work with teachers and TAs from other schools to ensure consistency in provision. This has been particularly useful for a shared attendance policies.	£850 release time for teachers and supply cover costs.	Up to date knowledge in school, shared with all staff.
