Muslim	A follower of the religion of Islam.
Allah	The Arabic name that Muslims use for God.
Salah	The second pillar of Islam - Muslims pray 5 times a day.
mosque	The sacred place of worship for Muslims.
Eid ul-Adha	A Muslim celebration to remember how obedience is important to maintain a good relationship with Allah.
Prophet Ibrahim (Peace be upon him)	Known as Abraham in the Bible. He was willing to sacrifice his son to obey Allah. The devil tried to tempt his to disobey by he remained obedient to Allah.
Ramadan	A period of 30 days where Muslims fast during daylight hours.
Eid ul-Fitr	The day at the end of Ramadan to celebrate the end of fasting.

Main Beliefs

Muslims believe that there is only one God called Allah. They believe Allah is the only ruler of the universe. The word 'Islam' means submission and obedience to Allah.
