PE and Sport Premium – End of Year Report 2020/21

<u>Spend</u>

- £ 10 277 invested in coaching support from PE lead for staff and quality PE teaching across the school by PE Lead
- £3030 invested in Carre's Grammar School outreach including 1 afterschool sports clubs

Headlines

- The school has continued to work towards the School Games Award.
- Our PE Lead provided high quality PE provision for all children by teaching PE across the whole school
- The school entered into a KS2 Athletics competition in Autumn 2020 and a KS1 Change for Life festival in December 2020
- 100% of our KS2 children have had swimming lessons for 12 weeks including learning Safe Rescue techniques. We are ensuring our children catch up on missed swimming during the lockdown and improving future year's skills by taking all KS2 children swimming.

Impact

- After-school clubs include Table Tennis- delivered by a sports coach from Carre's and Tennis, Ultimate Frisbee, Skipping and KS1 sports.
- Recreational table tennis has been maintained at a high level of participation through the pandemic by continuing to offer a regular after school sports club as often as possible lockdown restrictions allowing.
- All Key Stage 2 children have had swimming lessons for 14 weeks at Jubilee Park during the summer term of 2021 as we have not provided swimming lessons since September 2019 due to the Covid 19 pandemic.
- Due to Covid restrictions we have kept our clubs open to 'bubbles' only and 69% across the school attended an extra curricular sports club during the year. This was the best we could achieve with the staffing numbers and bubble restrictions.

Continued Professional Development

- PE Lead and School Games Organiser met through online meetings to discuss PE provision during the pandemic
- PE Lead attended CPD for Active Number, Active Spelling, Active English and Lincolnshire Sports Partneship meeting in October 2020

Sustainability and Impact

- After school sports clubs have been reintroduced by staff during the final summer term of 2021 as restrictions have eased in relation to the pandemic. Carre's after-school provision has continued to deliver a table tennis club for as many weeks as physically possible to groups of 8-12 children from all Key Stage 2 bubbles.
- The school will continue to embed a culture of participation in extra curricular activities, receiving support from school staff, who choose to run extra-curricular clubs.
- 6 different virtual events including a Holiday Club have been shared with parents organised by the Sports Partnership. Every child took part in the Couch to Tokyo Challenge through participation in fun runs family participation at home. 140 miles were added by families and 144 miles from our fun runs.

Targets for 2021/22

- To develop a broad, inclusive PE curriculum which has planned progression for skills across different year groups.
- To participate in more competitions between schools once the Covid pandemic restrictions are lifted.
